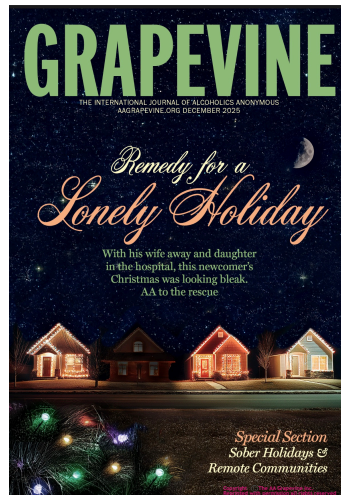
Let's be mindful of Tradition 7—self supporting. AA Grapevine is self supported through members purchases of subscriptions (digital and/or print), literature and other special items. At AA General Service Board, group contributions are down, **significantly**, compared to past years. A regional trustee mentioned at the State Conference, "...it would come out to \$13.67/year, per member, to contribute 7th Tradition to New York for AA to maintain operations and prudence." Now, of course, that would be the fellowship as a whole. Reading the quarterly GSO reports (found on aa.org) have helped me understand how important my contributions are; I hope for the same in fellow members.
